It was not until the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in 1987 that “all-male” service organizations had to accept women as members that Rotary International opened its doors to ladies. From that time onward, women have joined Rotary Clubs throughout the world and have been at the forefront of the organization’s efforts to provide necessary resources to disadvantaged people. By the mid-1990s, nearly 20% of the organization’s entire membership was composed of women. In 1996 Rotary International reported that the number of clubs with women presidents grew 50% during that year, amounting to more than 1700 female presidents of clubs within the organi-
