October 15th Program...Wayne Olmsted The Tustin-Santa Ana Rotary Club Founda- tion

Wayne Olmsted, Treasurer of the Tustin-Santa Ana Rotary Club Foundation, will discuss the funding and function of this foundation, and how it differs from The Rotary Foundation, whose headquarters are in Evanston, IL.

Last week's program...Oct. 1st Big Brothers/Big Sisters

Amanda Hastings has been with Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Orange County and the Inland Empire Chapter for 2-1/2 years. She chooses adults ("bigs") to interact with kids ("littles") from age 6 to 16. Often the mentorship goes beyond high school graduation. She also is involved with fundraisers and events for this National Mentorship non-profit. This chapter is the 5th largest in the country.



The success story of the organization is clear in the numbers it boasts: 98% graduate from high school; 70% are the first in their families to complete high school; 83% enroll in college. If you are in the program for 1 year you are 75% more likely to obtain a bachelor's degree and 70% less likely to use drugs or alcohol. *(cont'd on Page 3)*

The mission of the organization is to *“Provide children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally supported 1-to-1 mentoring relationships that change their lives for the better.*

The focus is *“Prevention. Meeting a child’s most basic developmental needs.*

Volunteer requirement are: you must be 18 years of age, employed, a resident of Orange County, and you must commit to seeing your “little” twice a month for a minimum of one year.

Other amazing statistics: 100% of the kids in the

program have refrained from joining gangs;

97% say their “big” was the greatest influence in his/her life;

200 “littles” are waiting for a mentor match;

200 “bigs” are already volunteering.

Fundraisers include clothing drives, golf tournaments, gourmet dinners.

There is also training before you begin as a mentor, as well as some screening. You do what you like to do with your “little” and you both enjoy it.
